- 1. A winning parent is an example to his children.
- A. Your children watch you closely.
- B. Your children are looking for <u>integrity</u> and <u>transparency</u>.

 He who conceals his transgressions will not prosper, but he
 who confesses and forsakes them will find compassion.

 Proverbs 28:13

2. A winning parent knows his children.

A. Knowing them takes <u>time</u>.

And he said to him, "O son of the king, why are you so depressed morning after morning? Will you not tell me?"
Then Amon said to him, "I am in love with Tamar, the sister of my brother Absalom."
2 Samuel 13:4

B. Investing time communicates <u>value</u>.

3. A winning parent <u>deals with issues</u> regarding his children.

Then Absalom her brother, said to her, "Has Amnon your brother been with you? But now keep silent, my sister, he is your brother; do not take this matter to heart." So Tamar remained and was desolate in her brother Absalom's house.

2 Samuel 13:20-21

A. Children need to be <u>disciplined</u>.

Foolishness is bound up in the heart of a child; the rod of discipline will remove it far from him. Proverbs 22:15
