Q. Could it be true that <u>God is unfair</u>?

A. <u>No way!</u>

The parable is to warn us about our <u>attitude in serving Him</u>.

"Look, we've given up everything to follow you. What will we get out of it?" Matthew 19:27 GW

1. Beware of <u>bargaining with the Lord</u>.

And when he had agreed with the laborers for a denarius for the day, he sent them into his vineyard. Matthew 20:2

A. You can <u>trust God implicitly</u>. He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him up for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things. Romans 8:32

B. God will never shortchange you.

2. Beware of <u>comparing yourself to other people</u>.

- A. Comparing will make you <u>ungrateful</u>.
- B. Comparing will make you <u>envious</u>. Is it not lawful for me to do what I wish with what is my own? Or is your eye envious because I am generous? Matthew 20:15

C. Keep your eyes on Jesus.

And let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, fixing our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfecter of faith. Hebrews 12:1-2

3. Beware of seeing your service as a burden.

These last men have worked only one hour, and you have made them equal to us who have borne the burden and scorching heat of the day. Matthew 20:12
