And He was saying to them, "Truly I say to you, there are some of those who are standing here who shall not taste death until they see the kingdom of God after it has come with power." Mark 9:1

What does the Mount of Transfiguration teach us?

1. Jesus is the God of glory veiled in human flesh.

He has no stately form or majesty that we should look upon Him, nor appearance that we should be attracted to Him. Isaiah 53:2

His transfiguration was from the inside out.

2. Jesus is to be the focus of everyone and everything.

A. Moses (the Law) and Elijah (the prophets) point to Jesus. " Of Him all the prophets bear witness that through His name everyone who believes in Him receives forgiveness of sins." Acts 10:43

B. God the Father points to Jesus.

While he was still speaking, behold, a bright cloud overshadowed them; and behold, a voice out of the cloud, saying, "This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased; listen to Him! Matthew 17:5

3. Glory is coming, but it is preceded by suffering.

- A. The first coming is the cross, and the second is the crown.
- B. The glory of the crown outweighs the suffering of the cross. For I consider that the sufferings of this present time are not worthy to be compared with the glory that is to be revealed to us. Romans 8:18

In the midst of suffering, remember that His glory is to come.
