"Do not be amazed; you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who has been crucified. He has risen; He is not here; behold, here is the place where they laid Him." Mark 16:6

What does the resurrection of Jesus mean for all of us?

1. Jesus really is who He claimed to be.

The Jews therefore answered and said to Him, "What sign do You show to us, seeing that You do these things?" Jesus answered and said to them, "Destroy this temple, and in three days I will raise it up." John 2:18-19

- A. Jesus is the Son of God and God the Son.
- B. The Bible is <u>trustworthy and sure</u>.

2. God the Father accepted the sacrifice of Jesus.

"This Jesus God raised up again, to which we are all witnesses. Therefore let all the house of Israel know for certain that God has made Him both Lord and Christ—this Jesus whom you crucified." Acts 2:32, 36

- A. Jesus' death on the cross paid the price for sin.
- B. Jesus' resurrection sealed the means of salvation.
 ... and if Christ has not been raised, your faith is worthless;
 you are still in your sins. 1 Corinthians 15:17

3. No matter how badly you may have sinned, there is hope.

"But go, tell His disciples and Peter, 'He is going before you into Galilee; there you will see Him, just as He said to you." Mark 16:7

- A. Even your worst sins don't have to be <u>fatal and final</u>.
- B. God is not done working in you and through you.

You can be forgiven, restored, and set free.
