What's the deal with the conclusion to Mark's gospel?

- 1. The ending of Mark is a <u>disputed issue</u> among scholars.
 - A. The oldest manuscripts conclude at verse 8.
 - B. The language of the disputed verses doesn't seem to sync.
- 2. The disputed verses should not produce disputed doctrine.
 - A. The Bible does not teach <u>baptismal regeneration</u>.

 "He who has believed and has been baptized shall be saved; but he who has disbelieved shall be condemned."

 Mark 16:16
 - B. The Bible does not advocate <u>strange practices</u>.
 - 3. Mark wanted to convey the <u>amazement</u> concerning Jesus.
 - A. His <u>life</u>, <u>death</u>, and <u>resurrection</u> were and are amazing. The beginning of the gospel of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

 Mark 1:1
 - B. We are to live in a state of amazement regarding Jesus.
 "I have been crucified with Christ; and it is no longer I who live, but Christ lives in me; and the life which I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me, and delivered Himself up for me." Galatians 2:20
